Recycled water is wastewater that's been rigorously treated locally to get rid of any nasties. It's gone through a process of microfiltration and ultraviolet disinfection, on top of the usual wastewater treatment process. This means the water is completely safe to use for non-potable purposes.


Why is recycled water the smarter choice?
